THE ROLE

Reporting into the Principal Transport Officer and working with the Senior Transport Officer, the Transport Officer will specialise in strategic transport and early business case development across a multi-disciplinary transport programme. They will:

- support the Principal Transport Officer, Senior Transport Officer and programme team in preparing, implementing and monitoring the Strategic Transport Plan and the associated transport related strategies for the Western Gateway region
- Lead work packages on behalf of the programme team, ensuring that key stakeholders are engaged and consulted on project work, ensuring any impacts on our member authorities are considered and any opportunities to drive benefits are sought

- Actively engage with our Technical Officers and key project stakeholders to develop our projects
- Acquire, analyse and present transport related data and evidence to support decision making

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- To support the Principal Transport Officer and Senior Transport Officer in preparing, implementing and monitoring the Strategic Transport Plan and the Western Gateway Sub-national Transport Body policies, and associated transport related strategies for the Western Gateway region, including decarbonising the transport network.
- To advise on and support the development of the STB's strategies such as electric vehicles, freight, rural mobility, alternative fuels for freight, walking, cycling, bus, coach and rail schemes being delivered under the strategic transport plan.
- To assist in managing the development and delivery of strategies and plans for specific projects to business case stage, including sustainable transport infrastructure and promotion packages and schemes.
- To identify, analyse and present transport data and evidence in order to inform strategy development and decision making;
- To provide technical comments as required on consultations and strategic studies.
- To represent the Western Gateway Sub-national Transport Body at regional and UK level forums and other officer meetings and working groups.
- Support the Western Gateway STB's Senior Officers and Technical Officers Groups and teams in delivering complementary projects and programmes.
- To ensure that the Western Gateway STB's constituent members, the Department for Transport and stakeholders are consulted and engaged in the STB's work.
- To respond to enquiries, feedback and consultation responses on behalf of the Western Gateway, seeking information from officers and partners where necessary.
- To ensure that all work undertaken considers any impact on our member authorities work and seeks to drive value for money and benefit to our members
- To prepare reports and presentations for Board and other meetings.
- To support engagement with stakeholders, community interest groups and others in the development, review and implementation of the Western Gateways' strategies, policies and schemes.
- To procure and manage technical input and expertise by commissioning consultancy work for transport policies and projects.
- To assist in any other areas of comparable work as may be required by the Principal Transport Officer because of workloads and priorities.
