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THE ROLE

Reporting to a Capital Delivery Programme Manager, the Senior Project Manager will specialise in developing and delivering infrastructure projects with a specific focus on the technical and design assurance aspect of both project business cases and delivery.

As a Senior Project Manager you will:

- Be responsible for the delivery of projects and programmes, in conjunction with partners. This role will oversee the design and delivery of mayor / complex infrastructure enhancement projects.
- Work with the supply chain to deliver efficient design solutions which maximise of benefits of intermodal travel (road, rail, bus, walking, cycling, e-scooter).
- Establish and deliver strong, collaborative partnerships with Public Transport operators in the region, as well as with our Unitary Authority partners.
- Remain responsible for the project and programme benefits until transferred into Business-As-Usual activities either within the Combined Authority, or transport operator partners or Unitary Authorities.
- Work collaboratively with other Project Managers, including those working for Unitary Authorities in the region.

- Support the review and evaluation of projects in conjunction with the Head of Commercial, Head of Grant Management and Assurance, and the PMO Manager.
- Drive value for money and efficiencies through your programmes, identifying minimal viable products for infrastructure and system change projects.
- Ensure that safety, sustainability, equity and diversity are at the heart of everything we do, with a community lead ethos.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Lead multi-disciplinary project teams to ensure successful delivery.
- Develop, manage and influence schedules and cost plans.
- Ensure project scope links clearly with the overall Business Plan, Joint Local Transport Plan and Local Industrial Strategy.
- Manage change to project and programme requirements through the MCA's change processes and combined authorities change processes as appropriate.
- Manage and report risks, assumptions, dependencies, issues and opportunities across the programme.
- Lead meetings and present to key senior stakeholders on progress against delivery.
- Commission, procure and manage technical resources required for the delivery of projects via the West of England Professional Services Framework.
- Manage the procurement of construction contracts and subsequent contractual project management in conjunction with the Procurement & Commercial Team.
- Report on project progress to internal and external stakeholders and through the PMO, and democratic governance structure.
- Embed a strong team safety culture and ensure compliance to H&S legislation, including CDM.
- Ensure compliance to Environmental legislation and deliver best practice sustainability initiatives in conjunction with the Environmental Team.
- Manage the production of business cases to bid for project funding
- Develop, coach, line manage more junior members of staff, working with HR and PMO on the Combined Authorities learning and development programme.
- Coordinate the design approvals process in the MCA and across the Unitary Authorities, reporting progress to the programme manager.
- Manage design scrutiny, including review of business case documents such as Road Safety Audits.
- Review, scrutinise and summarise complex data for a range of audiences.

- Educated to degree level or equivalent in relevant academic subject with technical knowledge or have the relevant practical experience to demonstrate a commensurate level of technical knowledge within the transport sector.
- Good knowledge of UK engineering design and construction projects.
- Good knowledge of UK and EU Public Procurement Requirements.
- Excellent knowledge of the requirements of Corporate and Construction Health & Safety (Including CDM regulations).
- Qualification or significant experience in relevant project management disciplines and their practical application, including Risk Management e.g. APM or PRINCE2.

- Previous experience in the development and delivery of large-scale infrastructure projects.
- Management of design and construction contracts and negotiating contract changes.
- Managing multi-disciplinary teams.
- Line managing team members.
- Collating, preparing and presenting complex information to a range of key stakeholders to secure buy-in and engagement, including project performance reporting.
- Collaborative working environments.
- Leading and facilitating design scrutiny for infrastructure schemes.
- Analysing, summarising and reporting technical data for own use and the use of others.
