BACKGROUND

The West of England Combined Authority is seeking to appoint a Head of Health and Safety to join the People and Assets Directorate.

This is an exciting time to join the West of England Combined Authority. In the last year nearly three quarters of a billion pounds of new investment has been secured for the region. New plans are in place to deliver on Mayoral priorities to improve transport, skills and housing for our residents, take decisive action to tackle the climate emergency, and to support communities facing the cost-of-living crisis. THE ROLE

Reporting into the Head of Digital, Data and Operations and working closely with the Director of People and Assets, the Head of Health and Safety will oversee Health and Safety provision for the entirety of the organisation, specialising in development, implementation and maintenance of the Combined Authority's Corporate Health and Safety approach, policy and all related programmes.

The Head of Health and Safety will:

- Provide competent advice and support at both strategic and operational levels
- Support the delivery of the Metro Mayoral priorities.
- Develop a robust Health and Safety compliance programme aimed at embedding aims and aspirations of the Health and Safety policy.
- Support the safe and successful delivery of directly delivered projects.
- Further develop and implement a clear strategic Health and Safety programme that meets the current and future needs of the Combined Authority.

- Work with internal and external stakeholders in improving overall competence.
- Develop and deliver a 'step change' behavioural safety programme aimed at embedding Health and Safety as a core deliverable.
- Manage and coordinate other Health and Safety resources.
- Provide regular performance updates and reports to the Corporate Leadership Team and other stakeholders.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

The postholder will be responsible for providing competent strategic Health and Safety advice and support, including the maintenance, implementation and embedding of the Health and Safety Policy, and all related programmes, across all of the Combined Authority's Directorates and activities.

Specifically, this will include:

- Lead the Health and Safety service, including the team embedded in the Infrastructure Directorate, in delivering functional support, guidance and professional expertise to the organisation on all health, safety, wellbeing, environmental and quality matters.
- Ensure organisational compliance to legal, contractual, regulatory and nonregulatory standards and certifications.
- Accountable for the effective delivery of the Corporate Health and Safety action plan, with a focus on putting safety first, and achieving best practice across the organisation.
- Accountable for Health and Safety performance and transformational change.
- Develop policies, strategies, plans and initiatives and be accountable for delivering their commitments.
- Ensure the Health and Safety team provide subject matter expertise on appropriate legislation, processes and tools.
- Accountable for identifying training and development needs in relation to Health and Safety across the organisation.
- Provide visible leadership and role model behaviours relating to Health and Safety
- Ensure through the team the provision of support to the organisation on inspection and monitoring of the safety, environmental and quality performance of projects and monitor so that a consistent approach is taken to contractor occupational and construction safety across all work.
- Work with teams to determine practical and deliverable measures to improve health & safety performance.
- Provide a leadership role in the investigation of accidents and incidents and in the implementation of resulting recommendations.
- Provide the accountable single point of contact for legislative bodies.
- Develop and report on key Health and Safety metrics at Directorate and Corporate Leadership levels
- Ensure that office Health, Safety and Wellbeing is managed effectively.
- Deputise for the Head of Digital, Data and Operations and the Director of People and Assets as appropriate.
- Any other duties commensurate with the nature and seniority of the role.

- Development, implementation and maintenance of strategic risk reduction programmes.
- Mentoring and improving organisational competence.
- Experience of defending claims
- Providing strategic and operational guidance.
- Property and workplace Health and Safety.
- Development, implementing and maintaining corporate Health and Safety management systems, and related Health and Safety programmes.
- Broad industry experience, including delivery of major infrastructure or major engineering projects.
