PURPOSE OF THE JOB

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide functional support, guidance, and professional expertise to the teams within the directorate on all aspects of health, safety and wellbeing to ensure successful, compliant delivery of programmes and projects.
- Provide health and safety leadership advice to supply chain and UA HSW specialists.
- Lead HSW meetings and briefings with the teams and supply chain organisations to share and promulgate best practice and lessons learnt.

- Provide support to the teams on inspection and monitoring of the safety performance of projects and programmes. Monitor performance to ensure a consistent approach is taken to contractor occupational health and construction safety.
- Work with teams and the supply chain to determine practical and deliverable measures to continually improve HSW performance.
- Undertake formal site inspections and on-site safety conversations with delivery teams.
- Support teams in the investigation of accidents and incidents and in the implementation of resulting recommendations.
- Provide the day to day first point of contact to the teams and supply chain on all aspects of HSW.
- Support the HSQE HoS to change the organisational culture with respect to HSW.
